The 4th Indian Division was reassembled from its scattered parts to take place in this offensive with the 161st Brigade taking the place of the 11st Brigade which had been lost in the fall of Tobruk. The 4th fought a mostly diversionary battle in the middle of the Allied line while the critical action was taking place further north. The 5th Brigade was pulled back into reserve and participated in the final breakout on November 3rd.
