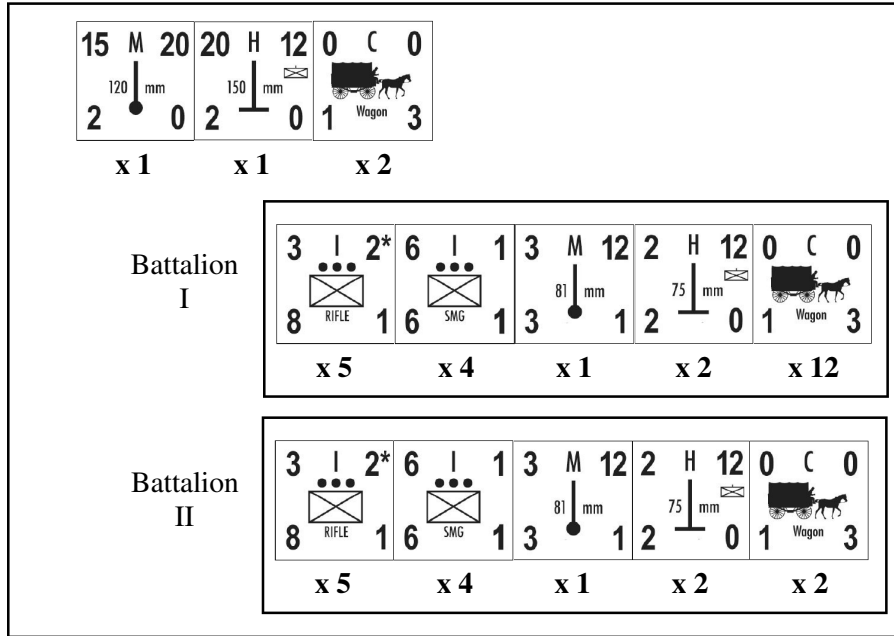




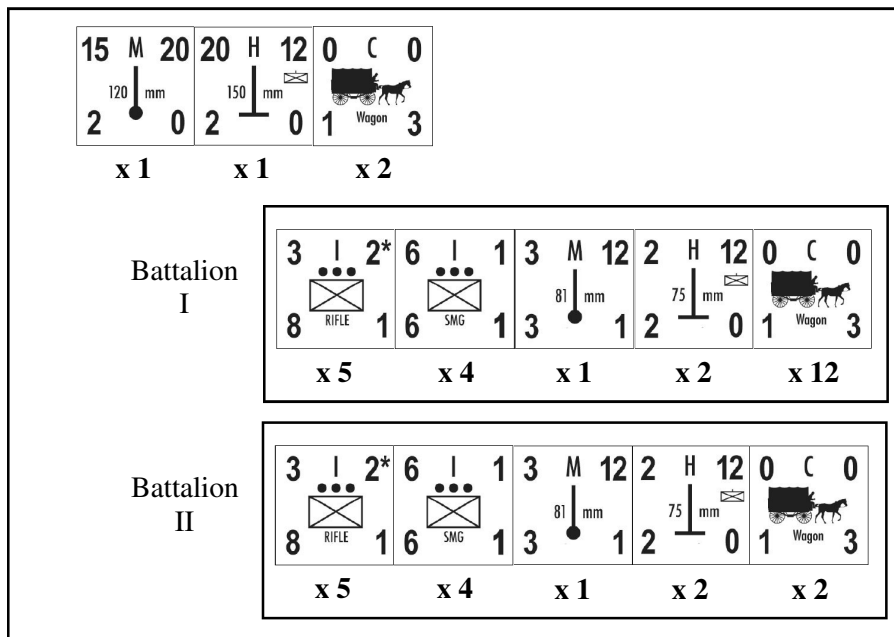

The 12th Volksgrenadier Division was assigned the job of clearing the road for the 12th SS Panzer at the start of the Ardennes Offensive. To help in accomplishing this task, the 217th Sturmpanzer Battalion (Brumbaers) was attached. The division succeeded quite well in this task until running into the 1st Infantry Division and, despite the support of an entire Volks-Artilleree Korps, it was unable to make any further progress. The 12th spent the rest of the battle in a defensive role.
