The 326th Volksgrenadier Division was supposed to support the Fifth Panzer Army on the Ardennes Offensive but, due to a shortage of horses to pull its artillery, remained in a largely static position south of Monschau for most of the battle. By January, the 326th had advanced to St. Vith but that was as far as it got before being forced back by the Allied counteroffensive.
